Known by Your Fruit

Matthew 7:15-20

Verse 15: Warning Against False Prophets

- o Command: "Beware" a continuous action, requiring ongoing vigilance.
- False prophets' appearance:
 - "Sheep's clothing" outward innocence and trustworthiness.
 - Inward reality "ravening wolves" symbolizing greed and harmful intent.
- Application: Stay cautious of those whose motives may not align with their appearance.

• Verse 16: Recognizing Them by Their Fruits

- Key principle: "Ye shall know them by their fruits."
 - "Know" (*epiginosko*): Full and thorough understanding.
 - Fruits: Represent teachings and their outcomes.
- o Rhetorical question: "Do men gather grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles?"
 - Emphasizes that good results cannot come from a corrupt source.
- o Cross-references: 1 John 4:1; 2 John 9-11; Titus 1:9-12.

Verse 17: The Nature of Good and Corrupt Trees

- Good tree:
 - Represents true prophets or teachers aligned with God's truth.
 - Produces "good fruit" morally excellent and beneficial.
- Corrupt tree:
 - Represents false prophets or teachers with a deceiving nature.
 - Produces "evil fruit" harmful and deceitful teachings.
- Adjectives:
 - Agathos (good) Nature of the tree.
 - Poneros (evil) Diseased or wicked.
 - Sapron (corrupt) Rotten and worthless.
 - *Kalos* (good) Quality of the fruit.

• Verse 18: The Impossibility of Contradictory Fruit

- Statement: "A good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit, neither can a corrupt tree bring forth good fruit."
 - "Cannot" denotes an impossibility due to the nature of the tree.
- o Principle: A person's character will consistently align with their actions.
 - $\blacksquare \quad \mathsf{Good\ character} \to \mathsf{good\ teachings/actions}.$
 - $\bullet \quad \text{Corrupt character} \rightarrow \text{corrupt teachings/actions}.$

• Verse 19: Consequences for Unproductive Trees

- Outcome: "Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire."
 - Symbol of judgment for spiritual barrenness and false teaching.
 - Imagery of divine retribution and removal.
- Application: A warning of the consequences awaiting those who lead others astray.

• Verse 20: Reiterated Principle

- o Conclusion: "Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them."
 - Restates verse 16 for emphasis.
 - Believers are tasked with recognizing and avoiding false prophets.
- o Responsibility: Help others recognize and steer clear of deceitful teachings.
