## "I NEVER KNEW YOU" (MATTHEW 7:21-23) LESSON BY JOSHUA ORTIZ

- I. Verse 21: "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven."
  - A. First, this teaches that not everyone will go to heaven.
    - 1. This verse destroys the teaching that says, "All will be saved!"
    - 2. Did you know that this truth hurts God?
      - a) 2 Peter 3:9
      - b) 1 Timothy 2:3-4
  - B. Second, by the wording we can see that there IS a group going to heaven.
  - C. Third, God's will must be obeyed.
    - 1. Ecclesiastes 12:13–14
    - 2. Jesus became an example for us (John 8:29).
- II. Verse 22: "Many will say to Me in that day, 'Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name?"
  - A. In the group of the condemned, we have a specific group who will have been very religious.
  - B. Notice they say three times..."in Your name."
  - C. Jesus is Lord
    - 1. There is only one Lord (Ephesians 4:5)
    - 2. God the Father gave Jesus all authority (Matthew 28:18)
  - D. Jesus said in Luke 6:46: "But why do you call Me 'Lord, Lord,' and not do the things which I say?"
    - 1. It is not enough to verbally recognize Jesus as Master.
    - 2. You must obey what He says.

- E. What other lords do people choose?
  - 1. Religious Leaders
  - 2. Self
- F. The Father has given Jesus the authority to Judge the world on the Last Day.

## III. Verse 23: "And then I will declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness!"

- A. Jesus will have the last word.
- B. The word "Me" translates the Greek word ἐμοῦ.
  - 1. Now the simpler version of that word is  $\mu o \tilde{v}$ .
  - 2. But Jesus adds the letter epsilon to the beginning to emphasize the word.
- C. For those who never wanted to TRULY know Jesus, Jesus will say to them, "I never knew you."
- D. Have you ever tried to correct someone of their faults?
  - 1. Did that person tell you, "Stop judging me! You shouldn't judge others!"?
  - 2. However, we are helping people get ready to meet the Judge who is coming.
- E. What makes Jesus qualified to be the Judge?
  - 1. He created of all things.
  - 2. He was a sinless man.
  - 3. He resurrected from the dead.
  - 4. God highly exalted Him.

## IV. WHAT IS OUR RESPONSIBILITY BASED ON THIS PASSAGE?

- A. First, we need to prepare for Jesus.
- B. Second, we need to help others prepare for Jesus.
